

Addressing Social Health and Early Childhood Wellness Quality Improvement Learning Collaborative

The Virginia Chapter, American Academy of Pediatrics (VA-AAP) is recruiting practices to join an 11-month quality improvement collaborative.

Participating practices will test and refine quality improvement changes using family-centered, strength-based approaches to screening, referral, and follow-up for maternal depression, social determinants of health, and social-emotional development.

National AAP and AAP Chapters will provide support to practices through peer-to-peer learning, education, and technical assistance to implement the project's change package which is eligible for 25 points of ABP MOC Part 4, 20 points of ABP MOC Part 2, and AMA PI CME.

Benefits of participating:

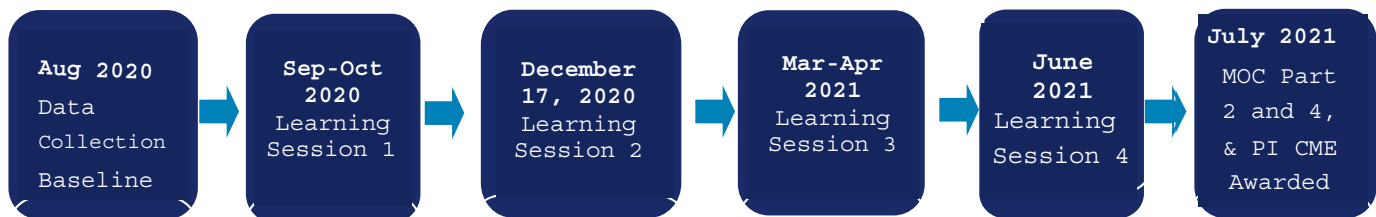
- ✓ Increase screening, counseling, referral, and follow-up rates using a family centered, strengths-based lens
- ✓ Expand referral partnerships
- ✓ Learn new QI methods and tools
- ✓ Track improvement through de-identified monthly chart data collection using the secure AAP QIDA (Quality Improvement Data Aggregator) system
- ✓ Network and problem-solve with expert faculty and other practices
- ✓ Earn 25 points of ABP MOC Part 4 credit, 20 points of ABP MOC Part 2, and 20 points of PI CME credit (pending approval)

Who should apply:

Practices providing pediatric primary care who:

- ✓ Desire to improve quality care to children and families
- ✓ Want to integrate screenings into workflow and reduce administrative burden
- ✓ Can assemble a team of at least 3 members with 4 roles to participate in the project:
 - Physician Lead
 - Clinical Support Staff
 - Administrative Support Staff
 - Family Advisor
