- Virginia Mental Health Access Program (VMAP)
 - <https://www.vmap.org/>
 - VMAP seeks to strengthen the ability of primary care providers (PCPs) to manage mild to moderate behavioral health needs of their pediatric patients, enabling child and adolescent psychiatrists to manage more serious and complex conditions.
 - Providers will have access to a phone number, website, and telephone/video consults with their regional VMAP teams. Care coordinators will identify regional mental health resources for children who need them.
